Lisa Myers' Bird Nests Workshop

Different species of birds nest in many different ways. Some birds make their own nests using twigs and leaves, while other birds use holes in a tree trunk. Some birds nest directly on the ground, while others nest on top of tall buildings. We'll talk about all the different ways birds nest and what we need to look for when birding.

Lisa Myers' Adults vs. Juveniles Workshop

Class: Thursday, June 27, 6:30 – 8:00pm

Field Trip: Saturday, June 29, 8:00 – 10:00am

To become a better birder you have to be able to identify the juvenile birds from the adults. Some birds are born precocial and are ready for the world as soon as they emerge from their egg; while other birds are altricial and need a lot of help from their parents before they leave the nest. Learning to ID an immature bird in juvenile plumage will make bird identification much easier.

What Do You Do If You Find A Dead Banded Bird?

Marilyn Porter, one of our mountain customers, called to say that she found one of her many pine siskins dead on the ground. She thought it might have been killed by a cat, but it may also have been one of the “puff balls”, or sick birds, that we have seen this winter. She noticed the band and called us to see if we had a phone number to contact a group that kept track of such things. The number we gave her was not valid anymore, but unperturbed, Marilyn started looking online and found the Bird Banding Laboratory under the auspices of the USGS.

She received a response from the “Encounter Data Manager” who asked for more information about her encounter as the migration of this pine siskin was unusual. It turns out that her bird was banded on September 23, 2012 in Haines Junction, Yukon Territory, Canada and was determined to have hatched in 2011 or earlier.

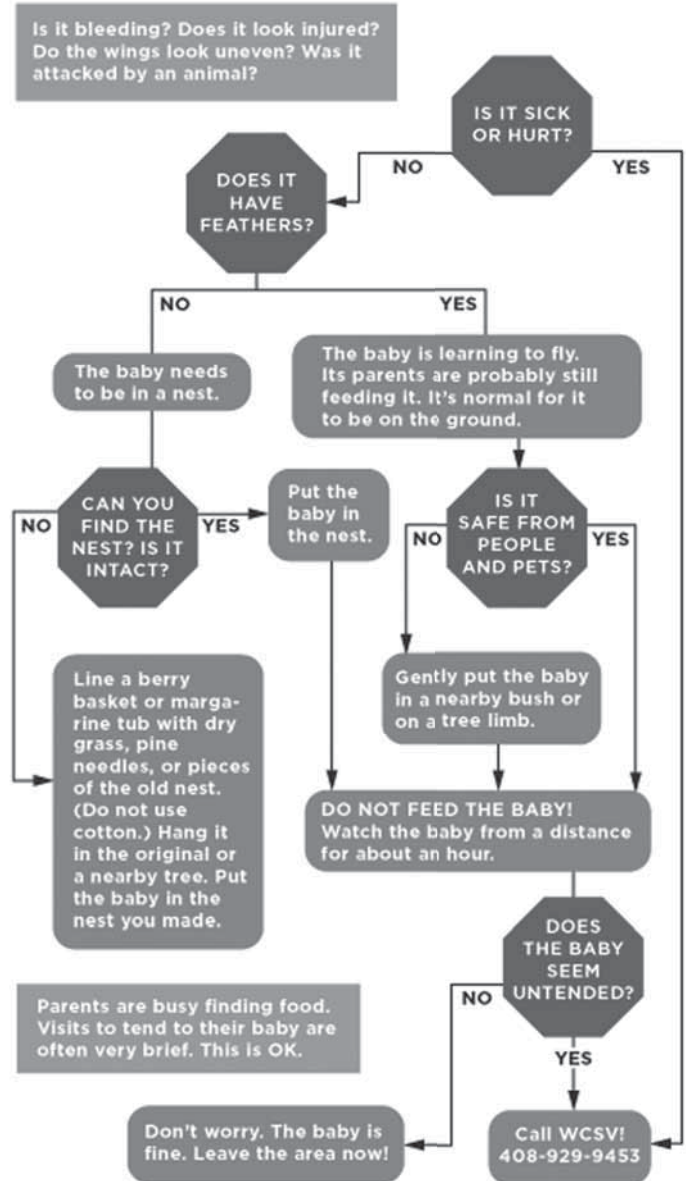
We helped Marilyn take photos of the bird with the band and the band separately then sent them to bandreports@usgs.gov. Marilyn received a nice email back saying, “Thanks again for reporting the band and for your help with verifying all the details. While we know siskins move south in the winter, the routes individuals take are still being discovered and it’s an incredibly interesting species. We have received just two other encounter reports of siskins banded in the Yukon Territory.” They even sent her a Certificate of Appreciation with the banding information. Thanks to Marilyn’s

perseverance we found out about the Bird Banding Laboratory and about the incredible journey undertaken by pine siskins.

Services Available from the Los Gatos Birdwatcher

- **Feeder Cleaning** – Drop off your feeders any day of the week. We clean on Mondays and Thursdays, asking only a donation to one of four charities (Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley, Wildlife Education and Rehabilitation Center, Nike Animal Rescue Foundation, and Friends of San Martin Animal Shelter). If possible, please bring your feeders in early in the day. We will call you by closing for pickup.

- **Frequent Buyer Program**, buy 9 bags 20# or higher of the same seed and get the 10th one free. Coupons do not apply.

- **Seed Delivery** in the local area, free for over \$40 total, \$4 charge for under \$40 total, available on Tuesdays and Fridays.

- **Monthly children's nature programs** and children's programs for pre-schools through 3rd grade. Also great for scout troops. For more information, ask for our new "Educational Programs Insiders Info" sheet.

- **Outreach to community organizations** about birding. We have birding and "Show and Tell" programs ideal for gardening and other service groups.

- **Backyard Bird Consulting Program** - Freddy will come out and see what you have, what you want, and what might work. The consultation is about an hour and the cost is \$20, which will be applied to any purchase of new feeders, seed, baths, or hardware.

- **Birthday parties with Build a Seed Feeder workshop**. Bring 11 of your friends to the **Los Gatos Birdwatcher** (or at your desired location) and build a birdfeeder. Learn about the different birds that are likely to come to the small hopper feeder that you construct from a pre-cut wooden kit. (Includes a packet of seed, use of tools, and instruction.) **Cost:** \$15 instructor fee + \$10/child (availability may be limited)

- We offer **Gift Certificates** and our popular "**Drop a Hint**" cards that allow you to choose a selection of gifts you would like (wish list) to be considered and when the gift giver comes in with the list, we know exactly what you want.

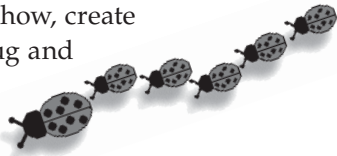
Bug Friends

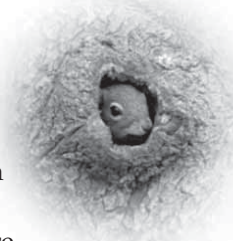
Hiding Places

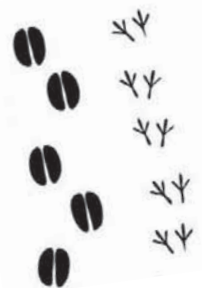


Animal Tracking Painting Workshop

Oka Ponds

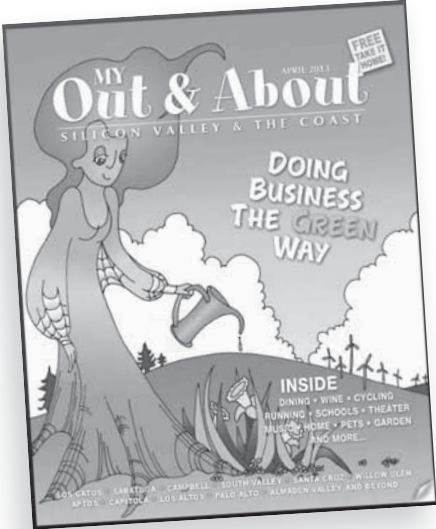

Let's Go Birding with Lisa Myers to Mitchell Canyon

Saturday, May 18, 8:00am – 4:00pm

Located in Contra Costa County, Mitchell Canyon sits on the northern side of Mt. Diablo State Park. With its rugged canyons, oak trees, chaparral and more, it's a wonderful place to bird. We'll be there in time for the tail-end of the spring migration which means we'll be on the look out for many different species of warblers, vireos, flycatchers and much more. We'll select trails that offer great birding and ease in walking.

Let's Go Birding with Lisa Myers to Caswell State Park in Search of Swainson's Hawks

Saturday, June 22, 8:00am – 5:00pm

Raptors are a favorite group of birds for many and Swainson's hawks are a target species. These birds winter in Argentina and come north to spend their spring and summer. We have to go into California's Central Valley to find this beautiful insect-eating hawk. While we are looking for Swainson's Hawks, we'll bird Caswell Memorial State Park located along the Stanislaus River near the town of Ripon. The Central Valley can get hot in the summer and this 258 acre park will offer us shade as we walk the trails underneath what remains of some of California's mature oak riparian forest.
